Indy Sports Foundation Allocation Application

Established in 1984, the Indy Sports Foundation (ISF) is a non-profit organization that supports amateur sports and its impact and influence on the common good of central Indiana. Our heritage includes a close alignment with the Indianapolis Athletic Club, which is now closed. However, the ISF initiates and organizes events for the community (including the Old Oaken Bucket Luncheon and the St Patrick's Day Celebration) which fund our mission. The funds we raise from these events are allocated to worthwhile entities that support amateur sports. In the past we have supported inner-city youth as well.

The Board of the ISF wish to thank you for taking the time to fill out this application. This Allocation Application is to be filled out by any person or entity that wishes to request money from the ISF for a particular purpose that is within our mission.

Rules:

- The ISF will make Allocation decisions once per year. Allocation Applications are due to the ISF contact by January 15 of each budget year. Applications sent in prior to December 1 (45 days earlier) will not be accepted. The application is available on our website www.indysportsfoundation.com
- The ISF will make decisions based upon information it can research or direct experience of the applicant, the information on the application, and any letters sent in support of an application.
- Please fill out this application as completely as possible. If you need an additional page or two to explain your application, please do so but try to be concise. A brochure, plan, or program may be attached.
- Allocation decisions of the ISF are final.
- Funding decisions will be made by approximately March 1 (45 days after January 15) and distributed thereafter.
- Anyone receiving an allocation agrees that the ISF may publicize the allocation in print or web media.
- ISF reserves the right to review performance of the funded program of an Applicant within a year of the funds being distributed to the Applicant.
- ISF may request additional information to assist the allocation decision.

- The ISF maintains the right to approve any Allocation Application under its own decision and discretion and the decision is completely that of the ISF. The ISF, in any given year, may elect to make no allocations, at its own discretion.
